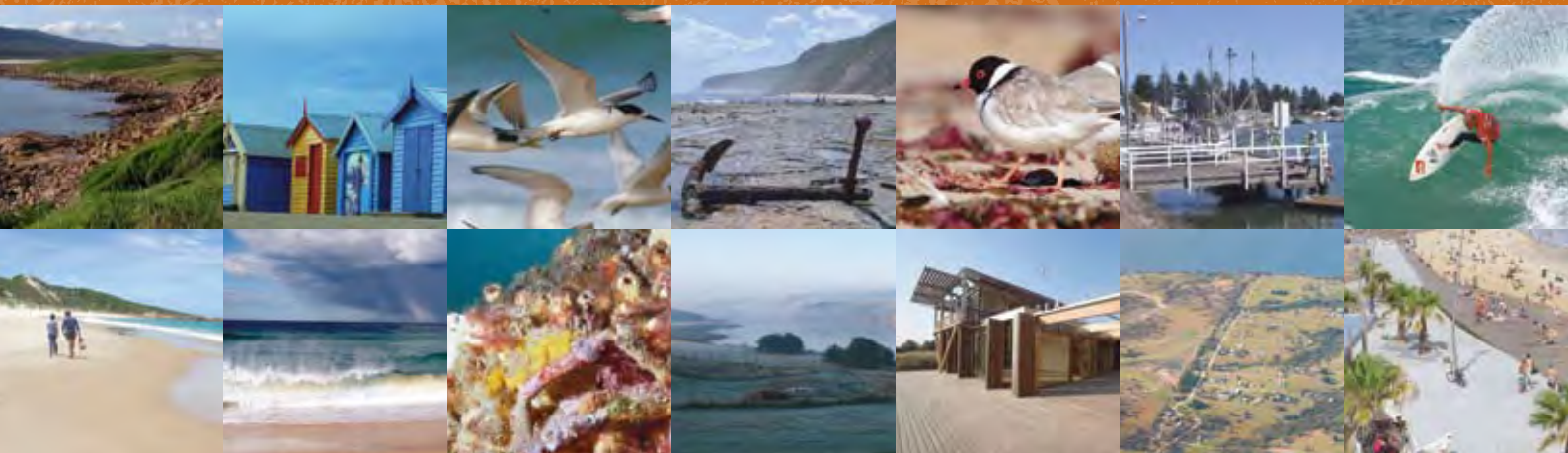

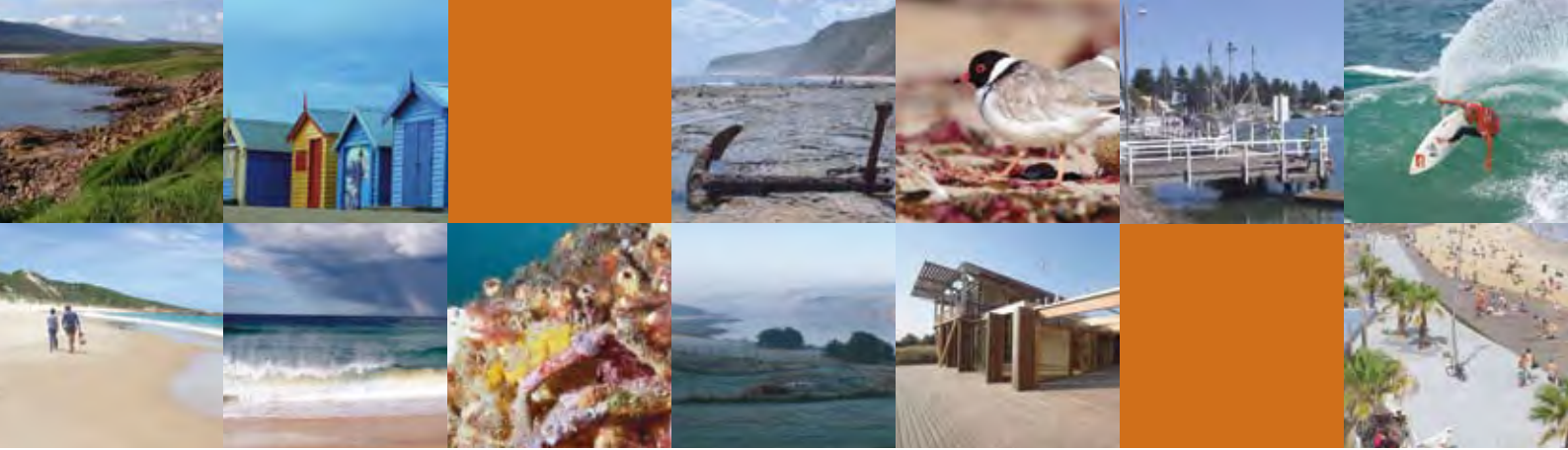

Community groups and Indigenous people can and do play a vital role in the coast's ongoing protection and conservation.

The Coastcare Victoria Community Grants Program 2009 - 2011 recognises the links between a resilient coastal environment and the involvement of community group volunteers and Indigenous people.

To support these community groups and their activities, funds are now available through Coastcare Victoria Community Grants Program 2009 - 2011.

The Key aim of the Coastcare Victoria Community Grants Program is to protect the ecological integrity of Victoria's coastal ecosystems by funding of on-ground works undertaken by community groups.

In addition the Program seeks to:

- Align community conservation works with current Victorian and Federal Government environmental priorities and strategies;
- Promote a deeper involvement of community volunteers in coastal natural resource management;
- Enhance community skills in, and knowledge of, coastal protection;
- Increase the engagement of Victoria's Indigenous people in the management and protection of the State's coast and
- Foster new partnerships between community groups and organisations working to protect the coast.

All incorporated community groups can apply for a grant. These groups include:

- Coastcare, Coast Action, Landcare, 'Friends of' groups, naturalist groups and non-government community organisations;
- Indigenous organisations, land councils, trusts and co-operatives working 'on-country';
- Community service organisations and clubs;
- Education institutions including schools and universities and
- Umbrella groups, network organisations and 'consortia' of community groups. Such partnership approaches will be viewed favourably, as they will allow for landscape-scale conservation.

Indigenous Grants

This grant recognises the long association that Indigenous communities have had with the coast of Victoria. Funds of up to \$20,000 are available to community groups, co-operatives, trusts, land councils and local governments.

Indigenous Coastcare Grants are designed to create new partnerships that will enable a greater involvement of Indigenous people in coastal management to protect our coast's natural and cultural assets. In particular, partnerships with coastal land managers are sought.

Indigenous grants will also enable groups to record and use Traditional Ecological Knowledge (TEK) for coastal management outcomes.

Indigenous Coastcare Grants are available through an 'open round' process. This means that you can apply for this funding at any time until March 31 2011.

Assessment criteria and weighting table

Note: To be eligible for funding, projects must first demonstrate that they *create new indigenous partnerships for coastal management, or, record and use Traditional Ecological Knowledge (TEK) for coastal management outcomes.*

Criterion	Weighting
Project addresses known threats/causes of environmental damage to key coastal asset/s	15%
Project directly engages volunteers/community members in on-ground works, and builds capacity of community groups	30%
Project engages broader community in management issue	25%
Project demonstrates sound project design and methodology	10%
Project demonstrates partnerships and consistency with existing strategies and programs	15%
Project demonstrates high Public Benefit	5%

Important Final Checklist

To facilitate the assessment of your grant application, make sure you can answer 'yes' to the questions below.

- Have you read the Coastcare Victoria Community Grants Program Guidelines?
- Have you discussed or developed your grant application with your Regional Coast Action/Coastcare Facilitator?
- Do you have the written permission of the land manager on whose land your project will take place?
- Does your project address the causes of environmental degradation, and not the symptoms?
- Have you completed your budget, excluding GST?
- Are you an incorporated body? If not do you have the written consent of an incorporated body agreeing to enter into a contract on your behalf?
- Have you included a photograph of the site you intend to work on?
- Will you be able to complete the project within the projected timeframe?

When you have answered 'yes' to all these questions, you are ready to submit your grant application.

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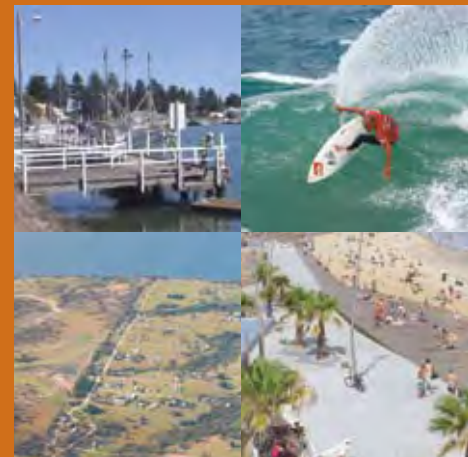
