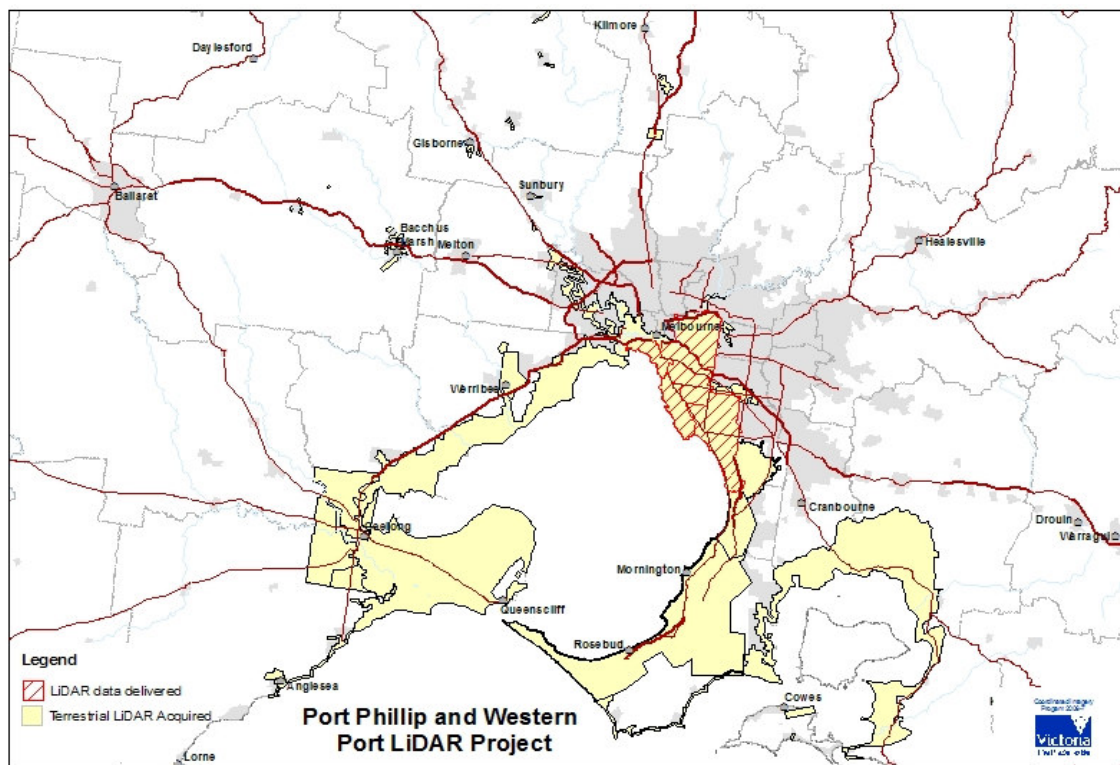

Update on the 2007 Port Phillip and Western Port LiDAR Project

All data for this project has now been acquired. Acquisition was completed on 26 July 2007.

With respect to data delivery, the first sub-project area (Monash Flood Project) and the Bayside Project have been delivered. The remaining Terrestrial LiDAR data will be progressively delivered as acquisitions are finalised over the next three months. The map below indicates the status of LiDAR data delivery for this project.

The Bathymetric data received to date has been delivered to CRCSI as part of the “Shallow Water LADS Analysis” project, although the balance of the Terrestrial LiDAR is still required to allow them to complete their research project. (For more information see May 07 Newsletter.)



Program Management

The CIP is committed to ensuring that capability and risk minimisation are primary factors for consideration in all projects. CIP representatives continue to investigate ways to improve relationships with purchase partners and suppliers as well as better manage internal CIP resourcing.

To aid in meeting these commitments a stakeholder database was developed to ensure that communication between the delivery and stakeholder management arms of the Program are as responsive and effective as possible.

The CIP is about to commence its annual Post Implementation Reviews from late August which includes facilitated workshops with its suppliers, purchase partners and the CIP Team. The aim of the workshops is to provide all parties with the opportunity for feedback and suggestions for improvement. As in other years, the results of the Post Implementation Reviews will be posted on the CIP website by mid December.

The CIP has prepared a list of FAQs, with input from stakeholders, and these should be uploaded on our website by end August. Your feedback and further suggestions are welcome.
